INAS 4th Tri-Nations Cricket Series Kimberley, South Africa 15 – 24th November 2011

The Australian Team recently returned from the 4th INAS Tri-Nations cricket series held in South Africa against England and South Africa. This event is a bi-annual one with the 2009 series being held in Australia.



The tournament took place at the De Beers Diamond Oval in Kimberley, South Africa with each team playing each other twice in 40-overs matches culminating in a final for the two top teams.

Match Report Game 4 – South Africa vs Australia

Australia had a disappointing end to the Series going down to home side South Africa in their final match. The defeat, Australia's fourth for the tournament, meant the 2009 champions ended the tournament without a win and it left England and South Africa to contest the final.

Australia won the toss and elected to bowl in an attempt to dismiss South Africa cheaply and reach the total rapidly to leap frog South Africa on the table and into the final.

The South African side was steady but, in compiling 174 from 40 overs, never got away from Australia. Australia's opening duo bowled superbly to limit the scoring rate but only managed one wicket which ultimately affected Australia's attempts to dismiss South Africa cheaply. Leg spinner Steve Teloniatis took 3 for 37 from eight overs and was supported by Searle with 2 for 26.

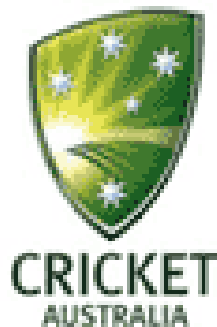
Though not a dominant total, South Africa's 174 was seemingly too great for Australia to pull off the fast-

scoring victory required to reach the final. Once Winston Johnson got ball in hand, Australia's ambitious plans to reach the final turned to mere fantasy. Johnson destroyed the Australian batting order, taking 8 for 15 from seven overs as Australia was dismissed for a meagre 46.

Not dwelling on their tournament exit, the Australian team ran a special clinic for students with an intellectual disability from the Durban school the following day. The school group had travelled over 800 kilometres to support the Tri Series.

The final was played between England and South Africa with the unbeaten English side holding off a determined South Africa to win the series by 19 runs.

The Australian Team was sponsored by Lord Taverners Australia and the team was prepared in partnerships between Cricket Australia, State and Territory Cricket Associations and AUSRAPID.



Aussies Leave Global Games with Golden Haul

The Australian Swim Team has wrapped-up competition at the 2011 Global Games after jam-packed four days of swimming in Italy, with the nine-strong team dominating the pool with a haul of 23 gold medals.

Standout performances from the meet went to teenagers **Amanda Fowler** and **Mitchell Kilduff** with the 14 and 15-year-olds, respectively, bringing home a total of 13 individual medals between them.

Kilduff showed true guts and determination in the 400m freestyle when he managed a negative split of three seconds to claim gold in a time of 4:20.70 and as the 50m freestyle world record holder was unmatched in the event winning in 25.78, not far off the 25.27 that gave him the world record in April.

When the rising star from SLC Aquatic combined with **Patrick Donachie**, **David Lee**, and **Ethan Chan** in the 4x50m freestyle they were a force to be reckoned with, the dream-team stole the race in 1:48.20.

The Global Games was Fowler's first chance to test her skills against international competition. Her outstanding efforts saw her take out seven gold medals; two of those were with teammates **Kara Leo**, **Nerice Holland** and **Taylor Corry**. The girls teamed-up to take out the 4x50m freestyle and the 4x200m freestyle relay.

Emily Schmidt, from Queensland, helped add another gold medal to Australia's tally when the team of Holland, Corry and Leo claimed the gold in the 4x100m medley relay.

After taking out the relay trifecta, Leo, the 18-year-old from NSW also impressed individually, collecting five personal gold medals. This was Leo's second Global Games appearance after competing in 2009.

Swimming Australia's Paralympic Head Coach **Brendan Keogh** said he couldn't be prouder of his team.

"It was a great effort by the whole team and they swam the house down," said Keogh. "It was a really tough meet with so many swims in four days, but they rallied and proved to have great mental toughness to finish so strong," he said. "I would particularly like to thank everyone at AUSRAPID for their support in organising the team and the event, which has proved vital at this stage of our preparation for London."

The Australian Swim Team won a total of 36 medals over the four days of swimming with all nine athletes amongst the medal winners.

He is very proud of these achievements and it is fantastic to see him develop and enjoy his sport of choice.

I feel that Dylan has brought far more to our club than we are giving him and it is so rewarding to see him in his element in the pool.

Kelly Wren Wins Prestigious Award

Kelly Wren of Engadine, NSW was named Most Outstanding Athlete with a Disability at the gala Newcombe Medal, Australian Tennis Awards at Crown Palladium in Melbourne last night.

“It means a lot to me, I’ve been playing since I was eight years old and now I’m 34 and it just means so much,” expressed Wren.

“I love the game and to keep playing at the age I’m at now, is just an honour and an honour to be an Australian as well,” she added.

The other finalists in this Award category were Benjamin Weekes (NSW) and Keegan Oh-Chee (NSW).

Wren had the honour of accepting the Australian Tennis Award from tennis great Neale Fraser.

“It’s great to see the thrill a person gets from winning such a trophy, and it’s great from Tennis Australia’s point of view, who create these awards,” Fraser said.

“I think these Awards do a lot for tennis, not only for the people with a disability but also for people who want to play the game for the rest of their lives.

“I’d like to wish Kelly all the best for the years to come,” Fraser added.

Nominations for this prestigious award were received from 1 August 2011 to 31 October 2011, with finalists, and the eventual winner, selected through rigorous process with specific eligibility and selection criteria.

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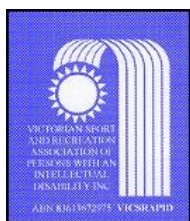


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
