

## Pearls clinch gold at the World Championships



**The Australian Pearls completed a clean sweep at the 6th INAS-FID World Basketball Championships with a powerful exhibition of quality basketball.**

Australia defeated the host nation Portugal 105 to 24. Despite being a very physical game the Pearls were dominant on the boards and were able to convert easily shooting at 52 per cent. All Pearls players took to the floor in the final, and they all got on the score sheet as well.

**As AUSRAPID enters it's 25<sup>th</sup> year of operation – it is exiting and rewarding to review the achievements of the first Australian Federation representing the sport and recreational needs of Australians with an integration difficulty.**

AUSRAPID was born after the visit of the eminent Swedish philosopher, Bengt Nirje, who visited Australia in 1985.

Bengt is revered as the Father of Normalisation, and during his Australian sojourn he spent time in Adelaide where he viewed the programs of SASRAPID, which at that time was three years old. He was amazed at how the concept of inclusion (normalisation) had been demonstrated in practical and effective examples of sports integration for participants with intellectual disability and other disabling situations.

At his bidding a concentrated effort was made to unite all State/Territory Organisations similar to SASRAPID, which were also in their infancy – in Western Australia, Victoria, Tasmania, Australian Capital Territory, New South Wales and Queensland. The common integrated sport in those areas was Netball, which had enabled the formation of each of those State/Territory Organisations. Netball Australia hosted the first National Sports Championship in Brisbane in 1985, before the emergence of AUSRAPID.

On July 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1986 AUSRAPID was born after long and painstaking meetings in Sydney by a group of very enthusiastic and practical supporters of the concept of sports inclusion. The energy generated by the original National Committee and the application of the first Constitution provided positive outcomes for those pioneers involved in this initiative, plus innumerable opportunities for the growth, acceptance and development of the participants now sharing in community life through sporting involvement.

In 1988, also encouraged by Bengt Nirje, AUSRAPID became a member of INAS-FID (established in 1986), and thus began the incredible work that has been executed throughout Australia and indeed the World.

The General Assembly of INAS, which is to be conducted in Canberra during April 2012, will provide an appropriate time to reflect on not only what has been and what can be achieved, but to acknowledge the foresight, energy and absolute enthusiasm of all persons who have been involved in this quarter of a century of positive gains.

Positive gains, which have ensured an ongoing quality of life for all persons with an integration difficulty who have benefited from the efforts of all involved with AUSRAPID and it's essential colleagues, who have exemplified the philosophy of our friend Bengt Nirje.

See you at the General Assembly.

The National Body led by Greg Brown and John Lill and the respective State/Territory Chairmen have maintained a constant support of AUSRAPID and our philosophy and we are extremely appreciative.

Co-captain Mina Aldobasic recorded a double-double with 20 points and 16 rebounds. Nicole Harris took 11 rebounds. Other top scorers include Eliza Barden (20 points) Natasha Exell (17 points), Kaite Papworth (14 points) and Bernadette Barden (10 points).

Australia have dominated at these World Championships, consistently demonstrating a high standard of skill and conditioning, a testament to the effort put in by these athletes and their coaches prior to the championships' commencement. The quality of the Australian program has delivered the ultimate reward.

After the game coach Larry Davidson said, "I am extremely proud of the effort the team has put in, from the senior group through to the rookies. Our goals included retaining our world ranking of number one while getting good experience for our development players. We have certainly achieved both," he said.

Despite being ranked number one, this is the first gold medal the Australian women have won since the Madrid Paralympics in 1992. The current Pearls pay homage to the many inspirational Pearls players who have represented Australia over the years.

At the closing ceremony Mina Aldobasic was awarded tournament MVP. Each of the Pearls were presented with individual gold medals and the team received a magnificent Championship cup.

The Portuguese Basketball organisation is to be commended for putting together an efficient and professional run World Championships.

The next event for the Australian Pearls will be at the Global Games in Italy in September 2011.

## Queensland are back in force in Basketball

The maroons are back in the Ivor Burge National Basketball Championships and they mean business!

Building on the Queensland contingent that competed in 2010, both a men's and a women's team will rejoin the Ivor Burge competition in 2011, for the first time since 2004.

Basketball Queensland entered a men's team in the 2010 Ivor Burge championships in Gawler, South Australia, while three Queensland women boosted the New South Wales Country team. Through a successful partnership between Basketball Queensland and Lifestream Foundation both men and women will now have the opportunity to represent their state in the Ivor Burge championships.

Team selections have been finalised and both the men's and women's teams are well into their preparation in the lead up to the championships which will be held in Maitland, New South Wales, from 20 – 26 February 2011. Players are drawn from throughout Queensland with representation from Brisbane, Toowoomba, Rockhampton and the Sunshine Coast.

The women's team will benefit from the wealth of experience that Nicole Skerman brings, having just returned from winning a World Championships with the Pearls at the INAS-FID World Basketball Championships in Portugal. Skerman was the only Queensland representative to join the Pearls in Portugal and will be strong influence on the court for the Ivor Burge team. Returning to the Ivor Burge competition will also be a catalyst for future Pearls from Queensland.

The Queensland women are in good hands with Head Coach Margaret Robertson, a former Ivor Burge coach and long-time coach of Special Olympics basketball programs in the Sunshine Coast. Robertson will coach the Women's basketball team at the Special Olympics World Games in Athens, Greece, in June next year and will be an asset for the Ivor Burge women's team in Maitland teamed up with manager Kath Reimann who managed the last Ivor Burge Women's team in 2004. The involvement of Margaret and Kath represents a positive collaboration between Special Olympics and Life Stream Foundation and demonstrates the commitment within basketball to provide inclusive opportunities to participate at the top level.

The Queensland men's team is going from strength to strength with a mix of experience and new talent. Thirty-five year old Bradley Lee is a veteran of Ivor Burge competition and an inspiration for up and coming players in Queensland. Lee started playing basketball when he was fourteen years old in a local mainstream competition in Gladstone, Central Queensland. He was an integral part of the Queensland Ivor Burge team that won the national title in 1997. At that tournament, he had the stadium buzzing when he made the first slam dunk in Ivor Burge history!

Lee went on to represent Australia at the World Championships in Brazil in 1998 and at the Paralympic Games in Sydney 2000. He currently lives and works in Darwin where he plays in the local competition at Darwin Basketball Association and also referees at club competitions.

Head Coach Kellie Fraser is confident that the team will be a force to be reckoned with at the upcoming Ivor Burge tournament.

He is part of a development squad coached by Liz Fiveash at Insports, Cornubia. Preparing the Queensland Ivor Burge teams has been a team effort. Thank you to Stephen Black, Association Services Manager at Basketball QLD and Jenny Bees, Sport Development Coordinator at Life Stream Foundation for their efforts. Both organisations will continue to work closely together to build on basketball participation at all levels in Queensland. 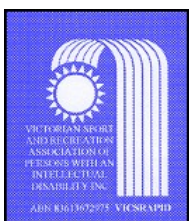
